A brief history of AWTP

 Estd 2004 - Pilot project in Glasgow . Now working over 11 different local authorities

- Recognition that the opportunities that lived/living experience can bring to Health and Social Care services in Scotland
- Support people with lived/living experience face multiple barriers to employment
- Over 350 people have completed AWTP since 2004.
- 90% of trainees complete AWTP, with 85% going on to find employment in the sector

What does it involve?

• Paid, full time, supported employment opportunity

- Employed 30 Hours per week Monday to Friday
- Training Complete over 30 pieces of individual training
- SVQ2 Social Services and Healthcare
- Placement
- Support

Applying for AWTP

Eligibility Criteria

- Personal lived or living experience facing barriers into employment
- At a stage in your life where you feel ready for supported employment within the social care field
- A time away from recent convictions
- Motivated to work in Social Care
