



Alcohol emergency since 2021



Alcohol harm has been recognised as a public health emergency by the Scottish Government since 2021





Over 20 years, +8,000 deaths, +90,000 hospital admissions, +£110m cost to NHS

- Slow heavy drinker rebound


Access to treatment



• From 2013/14 to 2021/22, 40% decline in number of people starting specialist alcohol treatment

Scottish Government has commissioned
 Public Health Scotland to investigate this

 Clear that there is a failure to prevent harm and a gap in treating it



Emergency response



- In April 2023, 36 organisations

 including 12 ADPs called
 for an emergency response
- AFS and SHAAP use this call in our national advocacy.

Call for emergency response to alcohol deaths

Campaigners in Scotland want deaths from alcohol to be treated as seriously as drug fatalities.

29 Aug 2023

- A member's debate in Parliament in Sept 2023 led to <u>cross-party</u> recognition of need to do more across alcohol
- Letters to Government and Parliament, including to Public Audit Committee in January.

Expanding the use of non-invasive liver tests like FibroScan in community alcohol settings

...those at high risk are identified sooner and provided with care and support

Establishing
Alcohol Care
Teams (ACTs) in all
acute hospitals

...patients with alcohol problems are identified early and provided with specialised, multidisciplinary support

3

Improving <u>access</u>
<u>to effective</u>
<u>detoxification</u>
<u>services</u>

...drinkers can access help to reduce or stop drinking safely, avoiding acute withdrawal

Emergency response 2.0



+ CALLS FOR NEW ALCOHOL STRATEGY

A new alcohol strategy should develop a comprehensive and integrated preventative system drawing on PHS's public health approach to prevention:

Primary prevention

Invest in the building blocks of health to stop problems happening in the first place.

Secondary prevention

Focusing on early detection of a problem to support early intervention and treatment or reducing the level of harm.

Tertiary prevention

Minimising the negative consequences (harm) of a health issue through careful management.

What's on the horizon?



- Public Health Scotland will publish findings from their investigation into the decline in access to alcohol treatment (imminent)
- Scottish Government, PHS and COSLA <u>10-year Population Health Framework</u> (focus on primary prevention) (imminent)
- A <u>'refreshed' alcohol and drugs strategy</u> from the Scottish Government following from the National Mission [National Mission 2.0?] across treatment, whole systems, harm reduction and long-term prevention for those most vulnerable to complement PH framework
- Scottish Government <u>National Specification</u> for alcohol and drugs services (early 2025), informed by new UK <u>clinical guidelines</u> for alcohol treatment (imminent)
- Scottish Parliamentary elections in May 2026

Local action leading the way?



- 30% of ADPs report having an Alcohol Harms Group to give specific focus to alcohol harm reduction work at a local level (increased from 21% in 2022/23)
- Pilots and "test of change" projects at a local level:
 - North East Glasgow Fibroscanning Initiative
 - North Lanarkshire Alcohol Summit!
- Alcohol death reviews/audits to evaluate future opportunities to prevent deaths due to alcohol
 - AFS Alcohol Death Researchers Network attended by 17 individuals.
 - Scottish Borders alcohol death review driving change and improvement in communication and workforce support in the hospital.
