



Prison/Justice Feedback

“Phoenix have supported me pre and post liberation through the recovery café, 1:1s and gate pick up. Without the ongoing support I don't know where I would be. I was not only supported with my recovery but with housing, finances, social work and family issues. I now attend the community service where I go to SMART meetings and Recovery Through Nature. It has helped me to maintain recovery in the community, build positive relationships and have structure, routine and purpose in my life. I have not re-offended and returned to prison as I have done previously and I put this down to the support I have received.” – Anonymous.



Prison Feedback

“The service has ran really well with Phoenix, both within the recovery café and the Librite in HMP Addiwell. After discussions with Amy she is keen to support as many people as possible. Amy is attempting to organise various recovery activities to change how we deliver the café and has a consistent number of prisoners attending. Phoenix work well with other 3rd sector organisations in Addiewell to assist with the link between custody and community.

Overall, this is a great service and we could probably do with a full time worker doing what Amy does, she is constantly getting people up to Librite to engage them with the service and seems really busy! The outcomes are noticeable and beneficial to all. This is evident in the current waiting list for the recovery café.”
